The 2024 Crop Season

The end of the 2024 crop season is fast approaching and as with most years we have seen our fair share of ups and downs.

Most started the year with good planting conditions that led in an abnormally hot and dry June. Things looked good throughout July only to have a late dry spell through the month of August hurting what could have been a stellar crop. In the end it looks as though most are going to be happy with their corn crops and a little disappointed in the bean crops mostly because of what could have been with one or two more rains.

Production only tells one side of the story. The most profitable time to market the 2024 crop was well before planting occurred so many farmers were reluctant to sell a crop they hadn't even gotten out of the bag to plant. The markets have spent most of the 2024 growing season hovering around breakeven prices and have slipped below

that threshold for many farms as we have entered the harvest markets. Input prices have come down but not significantly enough for producers to be profitable enough to cash flow ever increasing equipment costs. 2024 looks like it is going to be a slim year financially for farmers both locally and nationwide.

2025 looks like it is going to be even tighter as the early marketing opportunities we had for the 2024 crop don't look like they will materialize for the 2025 crop. Moving forward, understand that farmers are feeling the same pains as everyone from inflation as it affects everything from their seed and fertilizer to their parts and labor. Farmers are receiving less for their efforts than they were before this inflationary period. Don't look for any relief at the grocery store but rest assured it is not the farmer taking more than his or her fair share. However, they are still out there growing the cheapest and safest food supply in the world.
